


ECHA - who we are

EU decentralised agencies

- → Ca. 35 decentralized agencies in the EU
- → Ca. 2.5% of EU budget
- → Ca. 17% of all EU staff (14 498 staff in 2024)
- → ECHA is the 6th biggest EU decentralized agency

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
ECHA as an organisation

- → Established in 2007
- → Budget of ca. €128 million in 2024
 - → ca. €34 million fees from industry
- → Ca. 600 statutory staff
- → DG GROW European Commission partner / others DGs ENV, SANTE, EMPL
- → Memoranda of understanding with
 - → Other EU agencies EFSA, EMA, ECDC, (EEA)
 - → Third country agencies US, Canada, Japan, Australia etc.



- harmful chemicals





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Our key partners

- → EU Institutions
- → Member States
- → Other EU agencies: especially EFSA, EMA, EEA, ECDC
- → ECHA bodies, networks and expert groups
- → **International partners**: OECD, UNEP, non-EU countries
- → **Companies** /duty holders who have regulatory obligations
- → **Third parties**: citizens, local community, NGOs etc

Helsinki - hub for chemical safety and MS expertise

We bring together experts from EU countries and stakeholders

- → 4 scientific committees
- → 4 expert groups
- → Enforcement forum
- Networks of national authorities
- → Independent Board of Appeal In 2023: 50 meetings, 4000 visitors
